Dr. Russell Guyver is originally from London, England. He has followed a varied career as conductor, violist, composer and educator. As a violist he has played in many orchestras including the Scottish Chamber Orchestra, English National Opera, Royal Ballet and the Orquesta Sinfonica de Venezuela. He has appeared as conductor, soloist and chamber musician on four continents and is a guest artist at several annual music festivals in the United States and in Brazil. For many years he has been violist with The London Music Club Quartet, which tours internationally. Guyver is also in demand nationally as conductor and clinician at All-State conventions.

In 1984 Russell Guyver co-founded the String Orchestra of the Rockies, now a flourishing professional chamber orchestra based in Missoula, Montana. Also active as a composer, he received an Emmy for his score of a PBS docudrama. This year he premiered his one-act electric opera *Opera[tion] World Peace*, co-written with Brian Luedloff.

Guyver is Director of Orchestras at the University of Northern Colorado. Under his direction, the UNC Symphony Orchestra has been awarded "Best U.S. College Orchestra" by Down Beat magazine eight times and was selected to represent the USA in the International Cycle of University Orchestras in Zaragoza, Spain in 2003 and 2006. Russell Guyver received his musical training at the Guildhall School of Music in London, and, more recently he earned a doctor of musical arts degree in conducting at the University of Kansas under the guidance of Brian Priestman.

MB Krueger earned her bachelor's degree in music education and voice at Michigan State University (1990), where she was a National Merit Scholar. She received her masters degree in music education with an emphasis in choral conducting from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio (1995). She began her career in Michigan as a high school and middle school choir director, and then went on to teach and direct choirs at Lansing Community College. Currently, MB is an associate professor of music and acting Director of Choral Activities at Metropolitan State College of Denver, where she directs the Women's Choir and Women's Chamber Choir and teaches conducting and musical theatre. She has music directed over 40 shows, including *Into the Woods*(Metro), *La Cage aux Folles* (Riverwalk Theatre, Lansing, Michigan), *Forever Plaid* (Boarshead Theatre, Lansing, Michigan), and *Man of LaMancha* (Riverwalk and Metro). MB is the Newsletter Editor of the Colorado Chapter of American Choral Directors Association and regularly presents sessions at the annual CoACDA Summer Workshop. MB is also active as a clinician for middle school, high school, and college choral festivals, and has presented voice workshops for amateur singers in theatre and church programs. She is a member of Colorado's only fully professional chamber choir, St. Martin's Chamber Choir, as well as St. Andrew's Episcopal Church Choir. MB has also sung professionally with the Santa Fe Desert Chorale, the Santa Fe Opera, Ars Nova Singers, Diverse Passions Early Music Ensemble, and the Baroque Chamber Orchestra of Colorado.

A native of Hershey, Pennsylvania, **Dr. David Kish** is Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at Metropolitan State College of Denver. Dr. Kish conducts the Wind Ensemble, Symphonic Band, and teaches conducting and music education courses. He serves as a Faculty Fellow in the Center for Innovation, is founding director of the Metro State Wind Band Celebration, and received the 2010 Faculty Senate Teaching Excellence Award. Most recently, Dr. Kish was appointed Music Director and Principal Conductor of the Evergreen Chamber Orchestra.

Prior to his appointment at Metro State, Dr. Kish served as Associate Director of Bands and Franklin Fellow at the University of Georgia. His writings on wind literature, conducting pedagogy, and music education have been published in The Instrumentalist Magazine, Journal of Band Research, Music Educators Journal, Tempo, CBDNA Research Report, and the Georgia Music News. Dr. Kish has been on the Summer Music Camp Faculties at the University of Alabama, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and was Associate Director of Summer Camps at the University of Georgia.

Dr. Kish earned the Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in Instrumental Conducting and Music Education from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and the Bachelor of Music in Music Education from Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove, Pennsylvania.
